






Starting with a boat race over 50 years ago, the weekend long event now includes over 130 fixtures, from eSports to Ultimate Frisbee.









Entry requirements



Academic

Upper Second Class (2:1) Honours degree or equivalent in specified discipline (75%) Small number of masters require 2:2 equivalent (70%)

- MSc Human Resources & Consulting
- MSc Financial Management
- MSc Innovation and Entrepreneurship
- MSc Money, Banking and Finance

English Language proficiency:

- IELTS 6.5 (with at least 6.0 in each element) (valid 2 years)
- ToEFL IBT 87 (19 reading, 19 listening, 19 speaking, 22 writing) (valid 2 years)
- Pearson Test of English (academic) 58 with at least 50 in each element (valid 2 years)
- Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE) overall 176 with 169 in each element (no expiry date)

Except: MSc Advance Marketing Management requires a 7.0 IELTS or equivalent

Visa requirements



English Language proficiency certification is required by UKVI (United Kingdom Visa and Immigration):

- A <u>Student visa</u> is required for a full academic year. English Exemption forms can not be used in the application for a student visa.
- Double degree students entering on a Student Visa can apply for a <u>Graduate Visa</u>. A Graduate visa currently gives you permissions to stay and work in the UK for 2 years.
- An unconditional offer (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies CAS) is required for the visa application. Visa applications can only be made three months before the planned arrival date.

Application process



Nomination:

NCKU will nominate you to LUMS Global Experiences Team.

Application:

Nominated candidates will be asked to apply online by April 1st 2025 using our application system.

To apply, you will need:

- Bachelor's degree transcript (translated into English)
- Personal **motivation statement** maximum 2 pages
- Contact detail for one referee
- Language test certificate

All we need in order to initially process the application is your **degree transcript** and **motivation statement**- everything else can come later
