Mandatory Fees

All students, including exchange students, are required to pay Organization Fees per the University of Manitoba mandate. These fees will be approximately \$150 CAD per term and will vary based on the number of registered courses. Fee deadlines are subject to change.

Arrival Details and Asper Buddy Program

Airport Pick-Up Service

Wherever possible, the Association of International Management Students (AIMS) provides an airport pick-up service and student buddy program to incoming exchange students. They will contact all incoming exchange students to make arrangements. Email aimsmanitoba@gmail.com for information. You will be notified of preferred arrival dates to help ensure a pick up.

Health Insurance and U-Pass

Effective April 2018, exchange students will not be elligible for public health insurance coverage through the Province of Manitoba.

All students must purchase travel medical insurance for the duration of their studies

at the University of Manitoba. This may be purchased through your home institution, a private insurer in your home country, or through the University of Manitoba Student Union.

Exchange students may choose to opt in to purchase a U-Pass, a bus pass that provides unlimited access to Winnipeg Transit bus services for a full semester.

Fall U-Pass: valid from Sep 1 - Dec 31 Winter U-Pass: valid from Jan 1 - April 30

The cost is approximately \$220 CAD per term and exchange students can buy the U-Pass by bringing a copy of their fee statement and registration (available on Aurora) to the Answers Info Booth in University Centre during the opt in period. Please refer to this site for deadlines and further information.

Visa Information

Some students, depending on the length of study in Canada and their country of citizenship, will require a visa and study permit. Please contact your closest Canadian consulate for information about your specific visa requirements.

Effective March 15, 2016, all citizens from visa-exempt countries are required to have an Electronic Travel Authorization BEFORE arriving in Canada.

The closest residences to the Drake Centre are Arthur V. Mauro, Mary Speechly Hall or Pembina Hall residences. Students living in residence must pay council and programming fees of approximately \$150. There is a surcharge for students staying over the December/January holiday break. H

Learning Expectations

Language of instruction English

Class format

Lectures, class analysis/presentations, papers & projects, 39 lecture hours for each 3 credit hour course. Most Asper courses are 3 credit hours; a small number are 1.5.

Class participation

Class participation is required for most classes.

Course grading

Letter graded (A+ to F), with a D being a marginal pass.

Class size

Normally 40-60 students.

Course load:

3-4 courses per term are suggested. Students may take 5, but this is considered a heavy course load, especially for students whose first language is not English.



Course choices

Exchange students can select most courses offered at Asper during their exchange semester, as long as the student meets pre requisite requirements and there is space available in the course. Some courses may require professor approval for enrolment. Students may take courses outside of the Asper School of Business, such as in Economics, Psychology or History, but approval is subject to these departments, and may be hard to access. We encourage students to take courses offered at Asper.

Examinations: Format of exams vary. Final exams are written in the last 2 weeks of the school. Students must stay in Winnipeg until they complete all exam requirements. Requests of early leave of exams are not permitted. Exam resits are not permitted.
